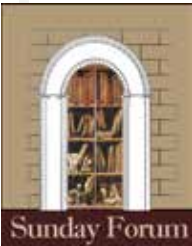

### **April 2:**

#### **What is Moral Injury?**

*presented by  
Pastor Duane Larson  
and Lee Thweatt*

A growing problem for military personnel, our civic protectors, and others is Moral Injury. Moral Injury most often erupts as a debilitating guilt suffered from an action one has done or witnessed that could not be avoided. MI can be related to, but is distinguishable from Post-Traumatic Stress. MI accounts for much of the increased suicide rate in combat veterans. Can people recover from MI? How can we as people of faith help those who suffer MI? On April 2, Lee Thweatt together with Pastor Larson (who is co-authoring a book about the subject) will lead a conversation about Moral Injury. Lee, a member of CTK and Vice-President of the Congregation Council, served as a United States Marine Judge Advocate General (military lawyer), and will share first-hand insights about MI.

## Stations of the Cross – Passion Sunday

We invite you to visit the Stations of the Cross in the parish hall between the Sunday services and following the late service on **Palm Sunday, April 9**. Starting with a presentation about Jesus in the Garden, it is designed to lead from one story to another. Ponder the trial of Jesus; struggle with the cross; grieve at the crucifixion; and wonder as the sadness turns into the pure joy of the Resurrection. Take as long as you want, thinking or praying, then you may pick up a scripture card, an item relating to the story, or both to remind you of each part of the story.

This *Stations of the Cross* was designed and made by the students in the 5th & 6th grade Godly Play class. The children learned the story of each Station and created an item to be carried away for each story, and they will host and lead the way through the presentation. We hope this will help you as you get ready for the Mystery of Easter.

## Personal Care Kits for Project Promise
