BIBLE READINGS FOR INDEPENDENCE DAY

Jesus told the people who had faith in him, “If you keep on obeying what I have said, you truly are my disciples. You will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.” **John 8:31-32 (CEV)**

My friends, you were chosen to be free. So don't use your freedom as an excuse to do anything you want. Use it as an opportunity to serve each other with love. All that the Law says can be summed up in the command to love others as much as you love yourself. **Galatians 5:13-14 (CEV)**

CARING CONVERSATIONS



Discuss in your home or small group:

- If you could be free of one thing in your life, what would you choose?
- How does Jesus set people free? What are we freed from?
- How does God want us to use the freedom Jesus gives us?

DEVOTIONS



Pray for people whose freedom is limited because of personal or social circumstances. Here are some suggestions:

- Pray for people who live in countries where personal freedoms are restricted.
- Pray for people who have been wrongly imprisoned.
- Pray for people who lack freedom because of poverty.
- Pray for people trapped in addictions.
- Pray for people who are unable to freely practice their Christian faith.
- Pray for those who serve communities and nations to keep others free.

SERVICE



Galatians 5:14 tells us to use our freedom “as an opportunity to serve each other with love.” In response to these words, plan an Independence Day act of loving service, for example; visit someone in a hospital or nursing home; invite someone to join you for the holiday; clean up litter in your neighborhood; wash a neighbor's car or mow their lawn.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



Although July 4th has only been a federal holiday in the United States since 1941, the tradition of Independence Day celebrations goes back to the 18th century and the American Revolution (1775-83). In June 1776, representatives of the 13 colonies then fighting in the revolutionary struggle weighed a resolution that would declare their independence from Great Britain. On July 2nd, the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence, and two days later its delegates adopted the Declaration of Independence, a historic document drafted by Thomas Jefferson. From 1776 until the present day, July 4th has been celebrated as the birth of American independence.

Sing or recite a national hymn like *O Beautiful for Spacious Skies* or *Mine Eyes Have Seen the Glory*. Take time to quietly reflect on the message of the hymn and the power and glory of God.
