CARING CONVERSATIONS



Discuss in your home or small group:

- How are the members of your family (or group) alike in personality? How are you different?
- When Jesus visited Mary's house, Martha was busy working, while Mary sat listening to Jesus. Jesus said that Mary had chosen what was better. What do you think he meant?
- When do you set aside time to listen to Jesus?

DEVOTIONS



Jesus said to Martha, “You are worried and upset about many things, but only one thing is needed” (Luke 10:41). In your home devotion times this week, share any worries that are on your mind. Pray about these concerns, asking God to care for you and give you peace. Recite these words together from Philippians 4:6-7. “Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. Then you will experience God's peace, which exceeds anything we can understand.”

SERVICE



Two of Sunday's readings illustrate excellent hospitality. Abraham and Sarah treated their guests like royalty (Genesis 18:1-8). Mary welcomed Jesus with her undivided attention (Luke 10:38-39). Think of someone outside of your usual circle of relatives and friends to invite to your home this week.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



Even when we are busy, we need to take time to listen to Jesus, as Mary did. Take time each day to hear God speak to you. Decide on a time during the day when members of the household will be available—perhaps before or after breakfast or at dinnertime. Try this simple format:

- a) Talk about the highs and lows of your day;
- b) Read the Daily Bible Readings;
- c) Discuss the meaning of the story or passage for your lives at the moment;
- d) Reflect quietly on what you have heard; and,
- e) Conclude with prayer.
